Congenital Heart Disease Statistics

- 1% of live births in the United States
- 75% are expected to survive one year
- 69% are expected to survive to 18 years of age
- Adult congenital population 5% per year
- More over the age of 20

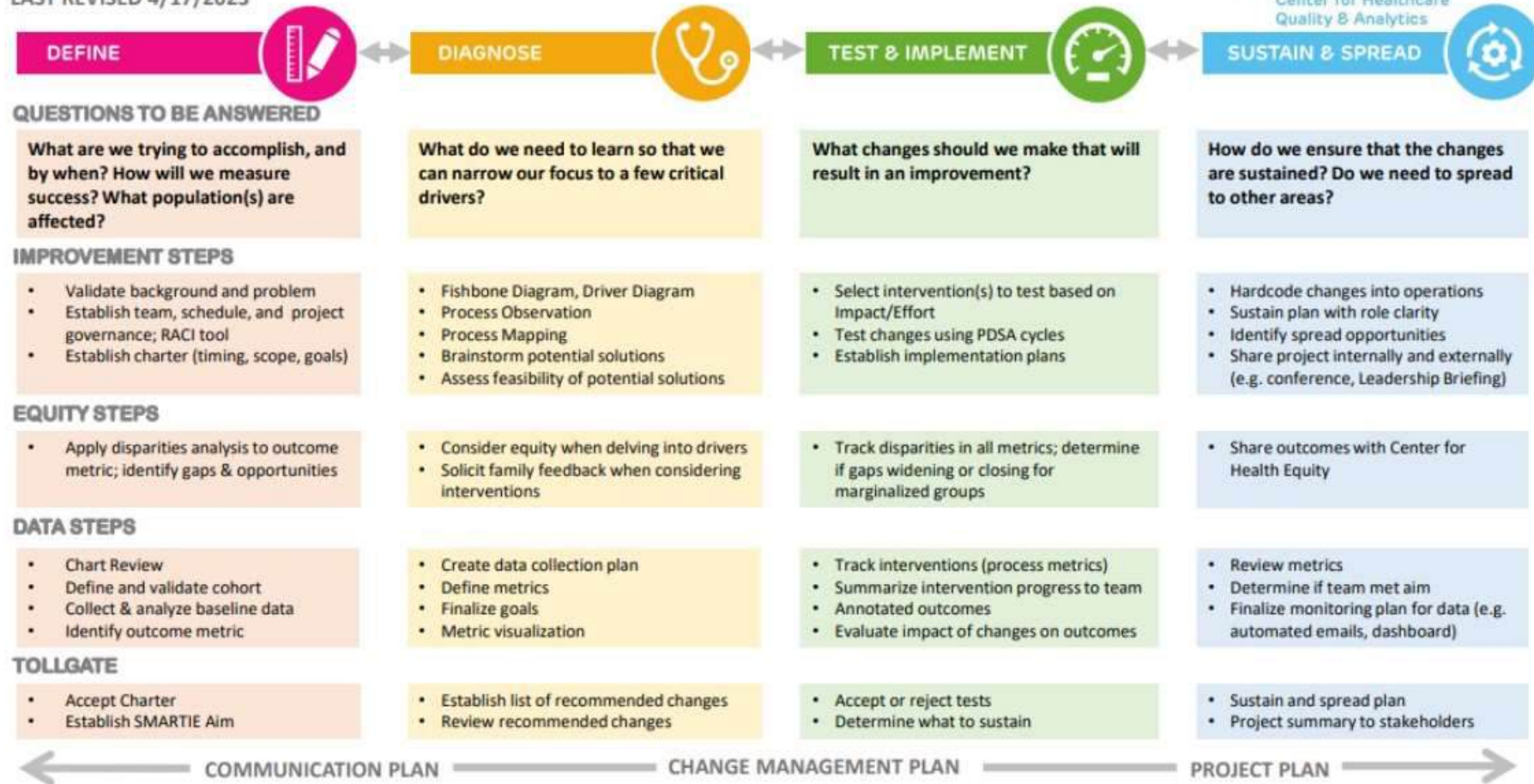

Goal of Quality Improvement



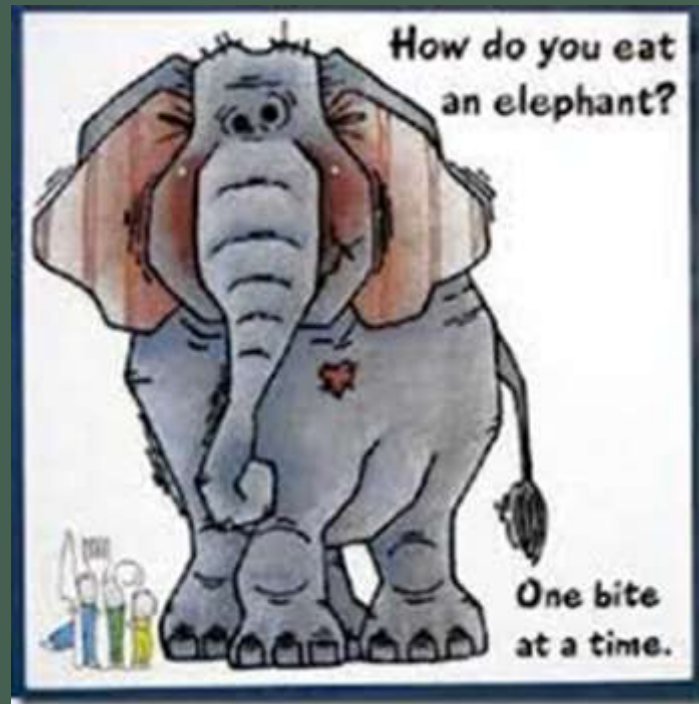
